




All Huxlow pupils are expected to listen in class, pay attention to the teacher and complete work set. Any pupil may ask for help if they do not understand what the teacher has explained.

Huxlow has a 'Code of Conduct' which are rules on how to behave. You will learn about this in LORIC time (Leadership, Organisation, Initiative, Resilience, Communication).

Staff may issue you with a detention, either for part of lunchtime, or after college. Detentions are given for lack of work, homework or poor behaviour. Parents will be contacted by the member of staff to inform them of your detention. Failure to attend detention will result in a senior staff detention. Many pupils never receive detentions because they do their best all the time.




Most of our students live in Irthlingborough, Finedon or Woodford.

These are current times of buses. The bus contractors may change in September. Please contact the college to check new times closer to the start of term.

Buses come onto the college site. They will drop you off and pick you up at the same place. Lots of teachers will be on duty. If you are late out of college and miss your bus, go back into college and tell a teacher. Never try to walk home alone.

If you lose your bus pass there will be a replacement charge. You can get a temporary pass from the Learning Centre.

The only way you will be successful is by being here. Many of our students achieve Full Attendance Certificates - for a term and also for a year.

If you are going to be away or late, we ask your parents to ring the college as early as possible and leave a message. If you are not at college and no message is received we will send your parents a message through My Ed or phone them. This way everyone knows you are safe and well.

Very few students are late for college after close of registration – 9:15am. If you are late, you must go first to the Reception or you won't be marked in.

You will receive detention if you are late twice in a week for college and could be put on a monitoring report.



Accidents or Illness

If you have an accident or feel ill at college, tell a teacher. School staff will contact First Aid if required. You will not be allowed to go home on your own. Your parents will be contacted if your Pastoral Leader thinks it is suitable that you should leave college, and parents will have

to collect you. You must not contact parents yourself. You must always sign out at the Reception before leaving the school site.

Doctor and Dentist



It is always better to have medical or dental appointments after college. Sometimes people need emergency treatment; if this happens, bring a letter from your parents and the appointment card, get your Pastoral


Leader to sign a yellow 'permission to leave site' slip it and take it to the Reception when you sign out.

The House System represents the values and ethos of the school and aims to develop as an integral part of our school community. In time it is our ambition that the Head of Houses and the School Council will work together creating a stronger pupil voice to motivate students and further the community spirit of the school.

House System Objectives:

Our aim is to provide every pupil in each house with the following:

- A sense of belonging within the school community
- Opportunities to develop social, intellectual, physical and practical

- Opportunities for leadership
- An awareness of individual and collective responsibility

House Organisation

Pupils are assigned to one of the four houses on entrance to the school in Year 7 where they remain until the end of 6th form. Each member of staff is also attached to a house.

Each house has elected a Head and Deputy House who will act as representatives for all the students in their house throughout the year by: helping coordinate house teams, organise activities and events and represent their house at relevant meetings.

HOW TO EARN HOUSE POINTS: GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION

Each House is in competition with each other to achieve the highest number of house points at the end of each term and most importantly by the end of the year when there will be prizes.

Regular house point totals will be advertised on student briefing and our internal Student TV.

Pupils can contribute to their house point totals in a number of ways both in and out of the classroom.

- Merits Pupils are awarded merits for outstanding effort and achievement.
- Fundraising Pupils will participate in fundraising activities.
- House Activities Every half term, students take part in organised House competition events ran by departments.
- Clubs Pupils can also earn house points for their involvement with clubs inside or outside school. These can be achieved by pupils showing commitment through high attendance, outstanding effort and outstanding achievement.
- Achievement Pupils can also earn house points for varying achievements.
- Extra-curricular Competitions Pupils can also earn house points if they
 regularly enter competitions advertised in school for: representing their
 school, showing commitment and an active sense of involvement with
 extra-curricular opportunities.
- Attendance Students who achieve 100% attendance in a term or those showing significant improvement.












You will have to prepare yourself for college. These are some of the things you might need to do or think about:

- Look at your timetable each night to see what books and equipment you need.
- Make sure you have your pencil case with <u>at least</u> a pen, pencil, ruler and rubber. You must also bring a reading book.



- Do you need P.E. equipment?
- Do you need something special such as cookery ingredients and an apron?
- Dinner money? Packed lunch? Bus Pass?
- Check your uniform look smart. This shows you are ready for learning.
- Pack your bag the night before college.

Make sure that when you get to college you keep your equipment safe. Do not bring the following things to college:-

- Valuable personal equipment such as computer games.
- Personal stereos.
- Dangerous sharp things.
- More money than you need.
- Jewellery (you can only wear a watch, one set of stud/ small sleeper earrings and one plain ring, NO OTHER JEWELLERY including facial piercings are allowed).
- No make-up is allowed in Year 7.
- Hair must be a colour that is naturally occurring. No hair style should be 'extreme' in style and/or colour.





At Huxlow your form room will be open to you at break and lunchtimes. The rooms need to be respected at all times. Keep them clean and tidy and free of litter.

You will go to your form room to register in the morning. There will also be a special time called LORIC (Leadership, Organisation, Resiliance, Independence, Communication) with your form tutor each morning.

Form Tutors/Pastoral Leaders

Your form tutors are your most important teachers. If you lose anything, are worried about anything, or are not sure of your lessons then ask your form tutor.

Your Pastoral Leader and Key Stage Lead deals with serious problems and, with your form tutor, they will contact your parents if necessary.

The Assistant Headteachers or Deputy Headteachers may be involved at an even higher level if your work, attitude or behaviour causes us concerns.









The college has over 150 desktop computers (4 of which are in the Library) over 175 laptops and over 100 tablets for student use around the college.

Huxlow Science College Library is the place to be when it comes to studying, reading and enjoying all the available resources. The Library is a quiet study area where students are encouraged to be independent learners.

The Library is open Monday – Friday, 8.30 am – 4.00 pm, during term time. The Library is open to all students before school, during break and lunch time and after school.

Students have access to fiction and non-fiction books, encyclopaedias, study guides and the careers library. Students are able to borrow books from the library using our computerised system. In the Library there are 4 desktop computers which are available for students to use as well as printer/photocopier.

A supervised Homework Club runs after school until 4pm Monday – Thursday and is open to all students. It is an opportunity to use the computers, books and other resources or simply a quiet place to do some work.





We all like encouragement and praise when we have done something really well.

At Huxlow we want you to know that your work and efforts are valued. We encourage good work by:-

- Giving house points for high standards of work or performance. We also use merit stamps to show achievement points on your work and on merit cards.
- Telling everyone at assembly how well you have done.
- Giving Certificates for lots of things from full attendance to achievements in sport, music and most other subjects.
- Sending letters home to tell your parents how well you are working. The letters might come from the Governors, Headteacher or staff.
- Helping you to set targets to help you to improve.
