Intervention - Healthy Friendships

This term, alongside our Anti-Bullying campaign, the Ethos Team have been actively providing interventions focusing on healthy friendships. A dedicated group of Year 8 students embarked on group mentoring sessions aimed at helping their peers identify and nurture healthy friendships while effectively navigating the challenges of sustaining them.

Looking ahead to the next term, Ethos will introduce "Miss Understood," a series of six insightful sessions covering crucial topics such as self-esteem, body image, friendships, emotions, puberty, and the impact of social media.

Additionally, Luke from the Grace Foundation will return to conduct a specialised group intervention designed specifically for boys.



Drop ins - Tues, Wed, Thurs Lunchtime

This term, we have welcomed an average of 24 students to our Drop-In sessions. During the past week, we focused on exploring the various types of love.

Students participated in an engaging activity where they expressed their thoughts by writing on strips of paper, which were then creatively linked together to form a heart-shaped paper chain.





Parents Anxiety Workshop



This term, the Ethos Team has hosted a variety of engaging events for parents, including a Parents' Anxiety Workshop, a paint and sip coffee morning, and our inaugural Community Coffee Afternoon at Crow Hill.



Anti-Bullying at Huxlow Academy

At Huxlow, we promote respect through a strong anti-bullying culture, including recent workshops for Years 8, 9, and 10 that empower students to challenge bullying and support their peers.

Our PSHE curriculum encourages open discussions on the difference between bullying and banter, helping students develop empathy and understanding.

We take a zero-tolerance approach to bullying, ensuring that all incidents are taken seriously and addressed to maintain a safe and respectful school environment.



Enrichment



We offer a wide range of enrichment activities every day, giving students the opportunity to explore new interests, develop their character, and build confidence.

These activities play a vital role in enhancing student well-being by promoting teamwork, resilience, and a sense of belonging within the school community.

Engaging in enrichment helps students develop important life skills beyond the classroom, supporting their personal growth and future aspirations.

Residentials

We offer our students a residential opportunity throughout their school life here at Huxlow.

In Years 7 and 8 this year, students have the opportunity to spend 3 days at an activity centre in Shropshire. In Year 9, there is a biannual trip to France and in Years 9 and 10, a biannual opportunity to visit Iceland.

In Year 11 there is a biannual trip to France and in Years 11, 12 and 13, there is the annual Tour of Remembrance to Poland. For students who also are choosing to stay on in our sixth form, once they have finished their exams in Year 11, there is a two day residential to build relationships before sixth form begins!

These opportunities are offered to build cultural capital and to take learning outside of the classroom.





Curriculum Highlights - Excellence in every classroom

At Huxlow Academy, our commitment to delivering an engaging and enriching curriculum is shining through in every subject. Students are embracing new challenges, developing key skills, and demonstrating enthusiasm for their learning. We are also pleased to note that staffing stability has improved, ensuring that high-quality teaching is maintained across the school.

Here are just a few of the fantastic things happening in our classrooms this term:

French

Year 9 students have been exploring French traditions and celebrations, showing a fantastic understanding of the cultural aspects of the language. Their enthusiasm for learning about different customs has sparked some insightful discussions.

In Year 8, students have been immersed in the world of French music, discovering artists from various genres and learning about the North African and Caribbean influences in Rai and Zouk. Many were surprised to find that global stars like Daft Punk and David Guetta are actually French!



History

Students in Year 8 had an unforgettable experience this week when amateur historian Ian Wedge visited Huxlow to share his expertise on the First World War.

With a fascinating collection of historical artifacts —including a real WWI helmet recovered from a battlefield and a decade-old WWI-style biscuit—he truly brought history to life.

Students responded with insightful questions, showing curiosity, respect, and engagement, fully embracing The Huxlow Way.



Mathematics

Mathematics at Huxlow continues to challenge and stretch students at all levels:

Year 13 and Year 12 have been focused on their mock examinations, demonstrating resilience and problem-solving skills.

Year 11 have been reviewing their mock feedback and pushing forward with their GCSE scheme of work.

Further GCSE Maths students have shown real dedication, attending after-school sessions every Thursday to prepare for A-Level Maths. A group of 14 students is already showing great promise!

Year 10 & Year 9 – 60 Year 10 students from the top sets and 30 of the most able Year 9 students took part in the prestigious UK Maths Challenge, a national competition designed to develop high-level problem-solving skills.

Year 8 have been investigating circles and mastering key concepts in geometry.

Year 7 have been developing their understanding of perimeter and area, with one group trialling an inquiry-based lesson where they asked questions to explore a puzzle or problem—an exciting step in fostering independent learning!



Curriculum Highlights - Excellence in every classroom English

Year 7 have been diving into Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, bringing the play to life through discussion and creative activities, which will continue into next term.

Year 8 have been exploring non-fiction texts through the lens of Conflict, examining how figures like Mary Seacole have been represented throughout history.

Year 9 have been engaging with poetry on themes of race and anger, leading to some powerful discussions. Their creative writing skills have also been put to the test as they enter their own poems into the Young Writers "Poetry Escape" competition.

Year 10 have been dissecting A Christmas Carol, with a particular focus on Scrooge's character and key quotations—a crucial step in their GCSE preparation.

Year 11 are deep into revision, mastering their Power & Conflict poetry anthology by securing three key quotations for each studied poem in preparation for their exams.

Smashed Tour

On February 13th, Year 7 and 8 students participated in the SMASHED alcohol awareness workshop, aimed at educating them about the dangers of binge drinking and alcohol abuse.

The workshop combined drama and interactive activities, that highlighted the potential consequences of alcohol misuse.

- **Understanding the Dangers**: Students learned about the health risks and long-term effects of excessive alcohol consumption on both physical and mental health.
- Overcoming Peer Pressure: The workshop provided strategies for resisting peer pressure.
- **Building Awareness and Empathy**: Students developed a greater understanding of how alcohol abuse affects individuals and communities, fostering empathy for those struggling with addiction.
